And if you ticked 10,000 miles, check your oil immediately before it costs you dearly – as even though you drive a company car, you're still responsible for checking the oil.

A lack of oil can result in engine damage, which in turn could land you with a bill for upwards of £3,000 to replace – with most businesses reserving the right to recharge drivers for what they may consider is negligence.

What many of us don't realise is that an average engine can use 10% of its engine oil in less than 700 miles. That soon burns through your reserves. So you need to check it as often as you can – every 1,000 miles is recommended – a distance many of us drive every week.

Don't wait for your next service because that could be thousands of miles down the road, or for the red warning on the dash to light up as by then it could already be too late.

Simply don't take the risk – check your oil regularly.
